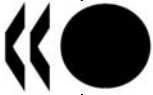

## ANNOTATIONS

### **Item I - Opening session**

The new Chair of the DAC Evaluation Network, Ms Eva Lithman (Sweden), will introduce the meeting and provide her view of the role of the Network in the context of current development evaluation challenges and evolving development policies. After the introduction, new members will be given an opportunity to briefly introduce themselves.

### **Item II - Assessing Development Effectiveness at Country Level**

In the morning, a series of presentations will be made to inform and prepare for the afternoon discussions, which will take place in break out groups. The objective of the afternoon session is to decide on a way forward and possible approaches for implementing an evaluation of the development effectiveness of aid at the country level. This has not previously been attempted and will necessitate careful methodological and analytical preparations as well consultations with partner countries.

At the end of the first day, a report on the results of the breakouts session will be made.

### **Item III - Evaluating Conflict Prevention and Peacebuilding**

The objective is to have a first discussion/brainstorming on new work in the area of conflict prevention and peacebuilding. At the recent meeting of the DAC Network on Conflict, Peace and Development Co-operation, members fully supported the suggestion to begin exploring work with the Evaluation Network to meet the needs in this area. This also follows the discussion at the first Network meeting on the results of the Utstein study on peace-building. The objective here is to provide directions for new work, identify members who are willing to participate in joint work and set a work process in motion.

#### **Item IV – Evaluation Methodology, Quality and Systems**

##### Review of ongoing work

a) Update on the Joint Evaluation Study

A progress report will be provided on the joint evaluation study. The study will cover recent experiences, lessons learned and options for the future conduct of joint evaluations.

b) Update on Evaluation of Multilateral Organisations

At the January 2004 meeting of the Evaluation Network, Denmark presented a paper on “Evaluation of multilateral organisations – proposal for a new approach”. A report on progress made since then will be provided together with information about a forthcoming workshop on the subject which is to be held in Copenhagen on 23 November 2004.

c) Evaluation Knowledge Management

The Secretariat will present the new website for the DAC Evaluation Network. The objective is to make this website as useful as possible to members and to add value to their own dissemination and information exchange efforts. A background document including suggestions on a broader knowledge management plan will also be provided.

d) Update on the Review of the Quality of DAC Evaluation Reports

An update on work will be presented by Australia.

##### Discussion on new work

a) Evaluation Systems and Structures

An issues paper will be presented by the Secretariat with suggestions on how to take work forward together with a summary of findings from two cycles of the peer reviews. As stated in the work programme [DCD/DAC/EV(2003)4], the aim of this work is to analyse the recent evolution of members’ evaluation function and to explore the feasibility of developing a complementary instrument/ reference tool to the DAC Principles on Evaluation.

b) Impact evaluations

The World Bank will present an initiative for joint action to promote impact evaluations.

#### **Item V – Evaluation Partnerships**

a) Partners in Development Evaluation

Suggestions and options on how to follow up on the workshop “Partners in Development Evaluation” will be presented by France.

b) UNEG and ECG updates

The Chairs of the United Nations Evaluation Group (UNEG) and the Evaluation Co-operation Group (ECG) of the Multilateral Development Banks will be invited to make brief presentations on their current work programme.

c) IDEAS

A representative of the Board of IDEAS will give an overview of current major work and ongoing preparations for a major international conference on development evaluation in spring 2005.

d) Trade Capacity Building evaluation

An informal expert meeting on Trade Capacity Building evaluations was held in June 2004. A brief status report together with an outline of planned work will be presented by the Secretariat.

e) Presentation of the CGD project on impact evaluation

A newly started research project addressing issues related to project impact evaluations will be presented to Network members by Mr Savedoff, Project Director, Global Health Policy Research Network and Centre for Global Development (CGD).

f) High Level Forum II on Aid Effectiveness

The Secretariat will brief members on the status of preparations for the High Level Forum which will take place on 28 February – 2 March 2005.

g) AFREA update

An update on the forthcoming African Evaluation Association conference (AfREA) on 1 – 4 December 2004 will be provided.
