Three New Ambassadors to the OECD**Portugal**

Ambassador Ana Martinho, born in 1948, graduated in law from the University of Lisbon. She joined Portugal's Foreign Service in 1975 and served in Portugal's Mission to the United Nations before returning to Lisbon in 1985 to take up a series of diplomatic and political posts. Most recently, she was Director General for Multilateral Affairs at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Ambassador Martinho, who replaces Ambassador Jorge de Lemos Godinho, is married and has two children.

Korea

Ambassador Duck-soo Han, born in 1949, graduated in economics from Seoul National University and earned his Master's and Ph.D. from Harvard University. He entered government service in 1970 and served initially on the Economic Planning Board before joining the Ministry of Trade and Industry. In 1998, he was appointed Minister for Trade at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Ambassador Han succeeds Ambassador Soogil Young.

Switzerland

Ambassador Wilhelm Jaggi, born in 1944, obtained his masters in economics and business administration from the University of Bern. He joined the Federal Office of Foreign Economic Affairs in 1973, serving in a number of different posts before becoming its vice-director responsible for export credit guarantees and export promotion in 1991. Since 1997, he has been Executive Director for Switzerland, Turkey, Liechtenstein, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan, Azerbaijan and Turkmenistan at the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) in London. He replaces Ambassador Jean-Pierre Zehnder.
