TAXATION RELATIONSHIPS AND INTERNATIONAL INVESTMENT FLOWS
BETWEEN MEMBER AND NON-MEMBER COUNTRIES
Paris, 26th-27th June 1990

- The OECD's Committee on Fiscal Affairs and Development Centre, in association with the Fiscal Affairs Department of the International Monetary Fund, is to hold a Symposium on 26th-27th June, bringing together senior tax policymakers from the 24 OECD Member countries and Yugoslavia, as well as from 23 countries in Africa, Asia, the Middle East, Latin America and Central and East Europe. Members of the business and trade union communities, as well as academics will participate in the meeting, which will also be attended by representatives of the main international organisations working in the tax area.

- The Symposium will be chaired by Mr. Jan Francke, Chairman of the Committee on Fiscal Affairs. It will be opened by Mr. Michel Charasse, Minister Delegate at the Ministry of the Economy, Finance and Budget, in the presence of OECD Secretary-General Mr. Jean-Claude Paye, Mr. Louis Emmerij, President of the OECD Development Centre and Mr. Vito Tanzi, Director of the Fiscal Affairs Department of the International Monetary Fund.

- The discussions will focus on the impact of tax regimes, particularly corporate and personal income taxes, as well as on the international allocation of capital and services. Four broad themes will be discussed:

- -- Worldwide moves towards tax reform;
- -- The policy implications of recent tax reforms on international investment flows between Member and non-Member countries;
- -- The impact of double taxation conventions on international investment flows;
- -- Tax obstacles to and incentives for inward investment in non-Member countries.
